



New Rainwater Tank Saves Water And Money Going Down the Drain

The Clem Jones Centre is saving up to 1.2 million litres of water a year with the installation of a huge rainwater tank following a \$26,636 State Government Grant.

Camp Hill Carina Carina Welfare Association Trustees Rolly Cowan and John Anderson, together with CEO Steve Heald, recently accepted the final installment cheque for the work at the Zahel Street swimming pool complex from Natural Water Resources Minister Craig Wallace and local MLA Chris Bombolas.

The new 125,000 litre rainwater tank will be used to top up the 50m swimming pool and any overflow after that will be used on sporting fields.

The 50m pool underwent significant renovation last year to comply with Level 6 Water Restrictions in South East Queensland.

It involved contractors replacing all the inlet and outlet pipes - over 300 meters of pipe, ranging in size from 50 ml to 200 ml.

The pool was first opened in February 1966 and has been transformed a number of times since then.
